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Our paper presents the two extreme positions - the elusion of the diagnosis and that of informing the patient of all the aspects of his/her illnesss - wich in a historical perspective have determined the practical attitude towards this problem and the psychological consequenses these standpoints imply. As an alternative we have described a solution based on flexibility and utmost respect for the patient's expressed claims on being informed and for his/her capacity to process the information he or she is being offered.

A few reference points have also been suggested - on this basis the practicing physician may bring to a successful issue the delicate task of selecting and imparting the information destined for the patient. The authors suggest that the practical implementation of individualized imparting of information represents also a challenge for the clinical psychologist engaged in the treatment of cancer patients. We anticipate his or her contribution to the appraisal of the patient s momentary capacity to cope with threatening information's, to dissolving the doubts and anxieties of the physician concerning the disclosure of relevant information's, and to handeling the emotional reactions of both - the patient and his or her family members ~ to the acknowledging of the facts.
